The Eleventh Hour God

So God split the hollow place ... and water came out, and he drank; and his spirit returned, ...Judg. 15:19

For study: Judges 15:12-19

One of the things we ought not do it is to *limit* the power of God. When we are in the face of a need, our responsibility lies in letting God know what we need and not to dictate Him, “How to give? When to give?” All because of the simple reason, He knows the *best* means and the time. Samson had a big victory by killing a thousand Philistines with the jawbone of an ass and now he was dying because he would not get water in that battlefield. He prayed and God broke up a stream that when he drank the water, his spirit which was departing, returned ‘back to him’. Often times we try to judge God with our standards and dimensions. As a matter of fact, our clocks run ahead of God’s. Let not time ever be a botheration to us because our times are in God’s hand. (Psalm 31:15) Time never ever goes out of the reach of God’s hands.

The spiritual vigor of God’s men has always been revealed by how they met great disasters yet dealt with them unhurriedly. Not acting hastily is one of the rockbottom attributes of a believer. (Isaiah 28:16) Make up your heart today to remain cool in your situation and let God act on your behalf in His own time. Worrying is trying to take God’s place and it is not going to help. He can do things right in the last moment. How many times God kept the life of David from the murderous hands of Saul? God is like the eagle who will spread its wings and bears before the falling eaglet touches the ground. He never misses once.
